


The Question of the South Selkup Dialectal Division

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Central and Southern Selkups in Tomsk Region (Тучкова 2014: 8)



- a) the Central dialects: 1 – Tym, 2 – Vasyugan, 3 – Narym;
- b) the Southern dialects: 4 – Middle-Ob, 5 – Ket, 6 – Upper-Ob (Sondrovo), 7 – Chaya, 8 – Chulyam

Grigorovsky N.P. 1879

1. Northern and Central š – Southern s

(Хелимский 2004: 71)

- **Grigor. ce** – Taz. šē (Хелимский 2007) – Nar. šε (Коробейникова 2009) – Chaya. Ča. $\overset{\text{š}}{s} \overset{\text{i}}{e}$ (SkWb 2420, Alatalo 2004: 346) – Bajdona OO šē, sⁱē; OO1 $\overset{\text{s}}{s} \overset{\text{i}}{e}$ (ibid) – Ket. KeUM $\overset{\text{s}}{s} \overset{\text{e}}{e}$, KeM $\overset{\text{s}}{s} \overset{\text{e}}{e}$, KM $\overset{\text{s}}{s} \overset{\text{e}}{e}$, KeO $\overset{\text{s}}{s} \overset{\text{e}}{e}$ (ibid) – Sondrovo OOS šē (ibid) – Taizakovo OOT się 'tongue'

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2. Southern dialects s / Central χ (Хелимский 2004: 72)

- **Grigor. cэр** – Taz. sıri (Хелимский 2007) – Nar. χır (Коробейникова 2009) – Chaya. Ča. sər (SkWb 2689, Alatalo 2004) – Bajdona OO sər (ibid) – Ket. KeM sərra, KM sırrə (ibid) – Sondrovo OOS sər (ibid) 'snow'

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3. -m (Southern)/ -p (Central) in auslaut position

Grigor. *кум* ~ *ком* – Taz. qum² (Хелимский 2007) – Nar. kup (Коробейникова 2009) – Chaya. Ča. $\overset{\circ}{k}um$, $\overset{\circ}{k}\overset{\circ}{\text{ü}}m$ (SkWb 1858, Alatalo 2004: 269) – Bajdona OO $\overset{\circ}{k}\overset{\circ}{\text{ü}}m$ (*ibid*) – Ket. KUM $\overset{\circ}{k}um$, KeM $\overset{\circ}{k}um$, KM $\overset{\circ}{k}um$, KeO $\overset{\circ}{k}\overset{\circ}{\text{ü}}m^{\partial}$ (*ibid*) 'man'

4. The **Southern Selkup k-** in the **anlaut position** instead of **č** or **ć** in the **Central and Northern dialects** (Хелимский 2004: 72)

- **Grigor.** *квә* – Taz. *cō* (Хелимский 2007) – Nar. *tçv'ε* (Коробейникова 2009) – Chaya. Ča. *k^üö* (SkWb 1435, Alatalo 2004: 208) – Bajdona OO *k^üö* (ibid) – Ket. KeUM *kvörg*, KUS *ku^ürgə*, KeM *ku^ürgə*, KM *ku^ürgə*, KeO *k^üargə*, KeOL *ku^ürgə* (+ ?SkWb 2256, Alatalo 2004: 327) 'pine'

Southern dialects

1. The **vocalization** of **m**

verbs in 1SG.ob and in nouns 1SG.POSS

-m (Central and Northern) ~ **-f** ~ **-y** (Southern):

не-y (Grigorovsky 1879)

дочь-1SG.POSS

Southern dialects

2. The diphthongization of vowels (Glushkov 2001)

Grigorovsky 1879:

ýэчъ «word» (GH 1655, Хелимский, Григоровский 2007: 220)

ýоры-, ыр- «to feast» (GH 1647, Хелимский, Григоровский 2007: 220), юéренди "drunk" (SkWb 276)

пýумбыгу „запутаться“ SkWb 595 (Хелимский, Григоровский 2007: 162), cf. пюугу «to tangle oneself» SkWb 595 (Хелимский, Григоровский 2007: 171)

Donner K. Chaya text

- **Diphthongs:**

- *j̥ɛrəŋ* drink3SG.sub (Künnap 1992: 142)

/ йоры-, ыр- «to feast» (GH 1647,

Хелимский, Григоровский 2007: 220),

юéренди "drunk" (cf. SkWb 276)

- *s̥iérna* (Künnap 1992: 141)

/ *sérgu* „войти/enter” (Григоровский 1879)

Donner K. Chaya text

- Assimilation of consonants **nd** ~ **dd**, **mb** ~ **bb**

orə-b-bdžət

strength-VBLz-DURTR3SG.ob

(Künnap 1992: 141)


órymbat

grow-PSTN3PL

(Григоровский 1879 a)

- In 20 century recordings remained in Sondrovo, Taizakovo.
- Not found in the idiolect by Pidogina Marina Pavlovna (Kanirovo, Kostenkino)

Southern dialects



The aerial extent of the dialect is not clear. It cannot be excluded that it could have spread along and down the Chaya to the region around the Chaya's rivermouth.
