main objective

establish UT as a center for research and education in Digital Humanities

- → form an international, interdisciplinary research team
- → carry out cutting-edge, interdisciplinary research using modern digital methods applied to textual data in Humanities and Social Sciences
- → create a DH hub aimed at ensuring sustainable excellence in related research
- → key outcomes:
 - promote and co-develop tools for Estonian, especially LLMs
 - expand academic curricula in DH at all levels of higher education
 - offer workshops, training schools, conference, etc.
 - strengthen the basis for collaboration with other institutes at UT, GLAM institutions and industry start-ups
